## UND Pride Cards NEW for Fall 2008 Financial Aid Disbursement

UND has entered into a contract for services with Higher One for the disbursement of student refunds (excess financial aid and other refunds) and implementation of the UND Pride Card. The contract was reviewed by UND General Counsel to ensure compliance with all applicable laws and regulations, including FERPA. Here's how it works:

- Students start by simply activating their cards and identifying a preference for receiving refunds from the University—either direct deposit to their personal bank/savings account, or direct deposit to an account with Higher One.
- If the student opts for the account with Higher One, their UND Pride Card also serves as a Debit MasterCard®. For information regarding features associated with the Higher One account, visit [www.UNDPRIDECARD.com](http://www.UNDPRIDECARD.com).
- The UND Pride Card is not a credit card and Higher One is not a credit card company. Therefore, activating the card will have no impact on a student's credit score or credit report.
- If the student chooses to open a "OneAccount" with Higher One then the UND Pride Card may be used as a debit card. However, students will still want to closely track their spending to not overdraw the account with transactions that exceed their available balance.
- If UND Pride Cards are lost, there is a \$20 replacement fee.

## Meet UND's 11th President, Dr. Robert Kelley

Dr. Robert Kelley will be the 11th president in UND's 125-year history. Kelley has been the dean of the College of Health Sciences and professor of medical education and public health at the University of Wyoming since 1999. Before his present post, he was associate vice chancellor for research and executive associate dean of the graduate college at the University of Illinois at Chicago, and professor of biological sciences at the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences and professor of anatomy and cell biology at the College of Medicine, both at the University of Illinois at Chicago. At the University of New Mexico, he served as chair of anatomy and senior executive associate dean, as well as other faculty capacities. He has also taught at the University of California, Berkeley.

Kelley earned his bachelor's degree in biology and chemistry from Abilene Christian University in Abilene, Texas, in 1965, and his master's degrees in 1966 and doctorate in 1969, both in cell and developmental biology from the University of California, Berkeley.

Kelley and his wife, Marcia Bell Kelley, a lecturer in the University of Wyoming Department of Communication Disorders, have four children.

He will begin his term as President on July 1, 2008.
